*Tonight's meeting minute notes: All votes by the Village of Earlville Board of Trustees (herein "Board" or "Village Board") 5-0 are to be read as "aye" votes from Village of Earlville Board of Trustees members Corey, Hayes, Moore and Daniel Piliero. The "Village Office" is the Village of Earlville Municipal Office located at 8 North Main Street. The "Planning Board" means the Village of Earlville Planning Board.*

Mayor William Excell called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Board members present were Trustees Henry Moore, Margaret Corey, Gerald Hayes and Daniel Piliero. Also present was Village Clerk-Treasurer Kelly Beach.

## TRUSTEE REPORTS

Trustee Corey reported that the flyers and posters are out for July Community Days. Everything seems to be lined up and running fairly well. The next Events Committee meeting is scheduled for July 2, 2014. The Events Committee has invited the Mayor and Trustees to march in the parade. Excell, Corey and Hayes are definitely available, Moore has to work and Piliero is unsure if he will be in the area. Mayor Excell advised that Chenango and Madison County Sheriffs will be on hand Friday night for the Block Party. On Saturday, a Madison County Sheriff will be in the area.

Trustee Hayes attended the Fire Department meeting. The Fire Company asked if the Village's snow machine could be plugged in at the Bus Garage only when needed during the winter. Excell will speak to Tucker about the matter.

## NEW BUSINESS

No new business.

## OLD BUSINESS

It was previously discussed to charge a fee for outside food vendor permits. Local business owners feel that allowing outside vendors to bring in mobile vending carts will be taking business away from them. They feel that they are paying taxes on their business and putting money back into Earlville; whereas vendors that bring vending carts into the Village to sell food everyday will in no way be putting anything back into the Village. After a lengthy discussion, it was suggested that perhaps instead of issuing permits for all year sales, it should be for events only. Board Members agreed that would be a better idea and yearly fees of \$300.00, \$250.00 and \$200.00 were discussed. The Events that mobile vendors would be allowed to obtain a permit for would be Earlville Days, Farmers Market, Opera House events, Music in the Park, Christmas Festival and Winterfest.

## Motion #1-6.25.14

On a motion by Trustee Moore, seconded by Trustee Piliero, it was agreed that effective immediately, all Mobile Food Vendors must pay an annual fee of \$250.00 per calendar year (January 1<sup>st</sup> through December 31<sup>st</sup>) to set up in the Village of Earlville during the following events: Music in the Park, Earlville Community Days, The Farmers Market, Winterfest, Christmas Celebration and during events held by the Opera House. This fee will not be pro-rated; it will be a flat fee regardless of the date issued during the year. Mobile Vendors will not be allowed to set up business within the Village of Earlville at any times other than those above mentioned

Events. There will continue to be no fee for craft vendors or baked good vendors setting up for the Farmers Market. Motion approved unanimously, 4-0.

PUBLIC COMMENT


There was no public comment.
