NOTICE: Pursuant to Article 7 of the Public Officers Law §104-1, notice of this meeting was given to the media at least seven days prior and the same posted on the 22st day of December, 2008.

Village Mayor Toni Campbell called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. Board members present were Trustees Mark Doeberl, Gerald Hayes and Kim Boomhower. Trustee William Excell was absent. Also present were Village Clerk-Treasurer Christian Vischi and three members of the public.

The topic of snowmobile use in the village was discussed. Since the state law covers private property, discussion centered around providing better safety for pedestrians through prohibition of snowmobiles on sidewalks. On a motion to adopt Resolution 28-26 by Trustee Boomhower, seconded by Trustee Doeberl and carried 3-0, it is resolved that it shall be unlawful for any person to use, operate or ride upon a snowmobile, four-wheeler, three-wheeler, motorcycle or any other device originally intended for travel on the public highways whether licensed or unlicensed upon any sidewalk of the village. Any person or persons who violates, is prosecuted and convicted of any of the provisions of this resolution, or pleads guilty to such violation, shall be subject to a first offense fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00). Each additional offense within 365 days shall be subject to an additional fine of not more than two-hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00). The sole exception being during declared states of emergency.

A copy of the resolution will be posted to the village website and around the village, and publication will be requested in the Mid-York Weekly and The Evening Sun.

Discussion commenced on the preliminary 2009-2010 fiscal budget. Several budget lines were discussed, but no motion was made on the budget.

The next village board meeting is scheduled for 7 p.m. Feb. 10 in the village office.

A motion to adjourn was made by Trustee Boomhower. It was seconded by Trustee Doeberl and carried at 8:54 p.m.
